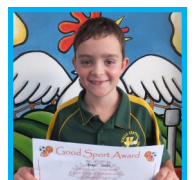

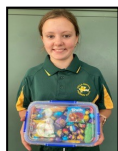

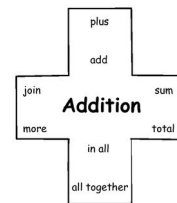

Our SMART Spelling focus this week is the digraph /ti/ making the 'sh' sound as in nation. We concluded that there are no words that make the 'sh' sound spelled /ti/ at the beginning of the word. In maths, we have a long unit of addition and subtraction. We are looking at mental strategies such as the jump strategy and the split strategy, which is partitioning (another /ti/ word) numbers. We made butter yesterday and wrote a procedural text about it, and will be moving on to use the butter in a single sliced sandwich today. In sustainability, we are going to consider the conservation efforts that are behind the Little Penguins of Phillip Island and for integrated studies, the major countries of both Europe and North America.

This week in SMART Spelling we are learning the prefix 'inter' meaning between. In Literacy we are learning about procedures; reading, writing and following them. Students will have the opportunity to make butter and fairy bread (and taste it too). In Mathematics, we are starting our addition unit and we are focusing on expanding out a number before we add it, as this makes it easier for us to add bigger numbers.
