



We are adding to our toolbox of addition and subtraction strategies and the difference between mental and written ways to add and subtract. Our studies of geography extend to countries of Europe and in sustainability, we have advanced our knowledge of fairy penguins and the efforts that have been made to ensure their survival. In the near future - down ball, cross country and Mother's Day breakfast. 3/4 Taylor This week in SMART Spelling we are learning contractions, e.g. did not = didn't. In Literacy we are learning about biographies. Students Addition will be reading facts about peoples' lives and writing their own biography. Our maths focus is subtraction, playing games and completing tasks that require an understanding of place value, known facts and counting back. 2025 K.C.P.S. Footy Tipping Competition Round 8 with Magic Magpies

Thursday 1st May

The **Bombers** held on to defeat a gallant **Kangas** by **3-points** in a Thursday night thriller at Marvel Stadium. The **Bombers** managed just 2 goals after the main break, but had done enough in a dominant first half to secure the **9.11 (65) to 9.8 (62)** victory.

Friday 2nd May

The **Saints** shook off a defensive start to explode in the second half, running out **14.10 (94)** to **5.3 (33)** win over the **Dockers** under the Marvell Stadium roof on Friday night. The win was built on the hard contest by the **Saints** and winning the clearance count 50-22 and the contested possession count 151-103.

Saturday 3rd May

The **Bulldogs** thrashed the **Power** by **90– points** in windy and cold conditions at Ballarat's Mars Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The Bulldogs mastered the swirly breeze far better than their interstate opponents, with the **Doggies** kicked 7-goals to 2 in the third quarter which highlighted their dominance of the game.

The **Crows** climbed to 4th on the ladder as the **Blues**' bubble burst after a massive **60-point** defeat at Adelaide Oval. The **Blues** were never in the hunt after conceding 5-goals to 2 in the opening term.

The **Magpies**, **Jack Crisp** - in his record-setting 245th consecutive game - had the opportunity after the siren to steal a win but his shot drifted right for a behind giving the **Cats** a **3-point win**.

It was certainly a sea-sawing affair at the MCG with a massive crowd of **82,514**. Well done **G-Towner** your 'black' cats ...were lucky this time!

The last game on Saturday night was in Perth where the **Eagles** hosted the **Demons** at Optus Oval. **Max Gawn** produced one of his greatest performances to lead his **Demons** to a straight third win overrunning **the Eagles** by **32-points**. Final score **16.12 (108) to 11.10 (76)**.

Sunday 4th May

The **Swans** has reignited its season with a 14-point victory in a fiery clash with arch rivals the **Giants** at the SCG. The **Swans** were at risk of loosing touch with the top eight after 3 consecutive defeats but this win gave their final hopes a much-needed boost.

The Hawks' superior clash and efficiency was on show as the proved too strong for the Tigers, pulling away after half-time to post their biggest win of the season to date. The Hawks won by a very comfortable 65-points 16.13 (109) to 6.8 (44). It is pretty obvious that the Tiges aren't travelling that well when their "die-hard' Tigers supporters like: Mrs O, FOPE, Triple Burger, Fighting Fury and Yellow & Black aren't tipping their beloved Richmond.

The **Lions** are still King of the Queensland Hill, storming to the top of the competition table with a **17-point QClash** victory over the **Suns** at a sold out Gabba on Sunday night. It was their 12th win from the past 13 contests against the Suns.
