Last Friday we had 12 students, across Grades 3 to 6, participate in the East Goulburn Primary School Sports Association's **Cross Country** at Kialla Lakes. The 10 and under age group ran 2km and the 11, 12/13 year old age groups ran 3km. Congratulations to **Clementine** who finished **4th** in the **10 years and under girls race** and **Flynn D** who finished **10th** in the **11 year old boys race**. On Monday all of our staff attended a **Curriculum Day** with **Nairn Walker** at Eastbank. Nairn presentation was on '**Celebrating Student Capacity**'. There were nearly 900 educators at this professional learning opportunity from across Shepparton and surrounding government schools.





## Round 9 with Magic Magpies

### Thursday 8th May

A six goal haul from **Jamie Elliott** helped the **Magpies** get over the line against a gallant **Dockers** by **14-points** at Optus Stadium on Thursday night. Elliott kicked 3 goals in the final term as the Pies secured a **15.7 (97)** to **12.11 (83)** victory.

### Friday 9th May

**Harry McKay** kicked his 3rd goal from an acute angle late in the quarter as the **Blues** overcame a barrage of injuries to secure the **11.11 (77)** to **9.8 (62)** win over the **Saints**. The **Blues** were quite impressive, rallying after injury chaos that left them with one fit player on the bench at half-time.

### Saturday 10th May

The **Demons** hosted the **Hawks** at the MCG on Saturday afternoon. The **Hawks** needed a hero after an underwhelming first three quarters where they kicked seven goals.
