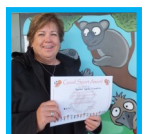

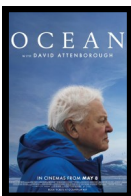

Our whole school annual swimming program at Aquamoves will take place next week **Monday 26th to Friday 30th May**. We will need some dad's to help us out in the change rooms on **Monday, Tuesday and Friday**, however, they will need to have a current Working with Children Check to help. We have managed to keep this year's swimming cost down to **\$33 per student**. Families are able to use their **CSEF or School Saving Bonus** funding. See Lisa if you have any finance questions. In Victoria, a swimming program is a requirement of the Department of Education. Since 2017, the



Victorian Curriculum F-10 (Version 1.0) has required swimming and water safety to be taught to **all students from Foundation to Level 10** as part of the Health and Physical Education learning area. The Victorian Curriculum F-10 (Version 2.0), released in June 2024, has further strengthened the place of swimming and water safety in the curriculum.

By the end of Year 6 students should be able to demonstrate the knowledge and skills identified in the Victorian Water Safety Certificate.

There are still a number of outstanding permission notes, please ensure they are returned to school no later than **Thursday 21st May**.

Coordinating 2 swimming groups to and from the pool takes quite a lot of organisation especially re staffing. Students not swimming will still be going to the pool and require their permission note to be returned as they will be travelling on the bus, and are leaving the school grounds. Alternatively, if your child is not participating in the swimming program and you are picking him/her/them up from school, I need a note explaining why for our records.

Please ensure all of your child/ren's uniform and swimming items are clearly named, this includes goggles.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION BELOW

During swimming week, we have lunch from **11.00am to 11.45am**. This gives time for students to digest their food before swimming. They then have a snack upon returning from the pool.

There are **NO** hot lunches during our Swimming Week.

Parents/carers are welcome to come to the pool to watch your child/ren swim. Families can take their child/ren home from the pool instead of coming back to school on the bus. If you're doing this, please send an email or note to your child's teacher outlining what days this will happen, advance notice would be appreciated. Teachers will then ensure that your child/ren have their school bags with them. If you have not arrived at the pool by the time your child/s group is ready to leave, they will go on the bus and head back to school.

Swimming is a busy messed up week, but such an important skill for all of our students to have.

In Year 5/6 SMART Spelling this week, we have the digraph /st/ making the 's' sound as in castle. Our mathematical focus is on mental then written methods of subtraction and a linking of the two processes – addition and subtraction. In integrated studies, geography, we have mapped the major countries in Europe and are moving on to the major countries in the Asian continent. As the writing genre this next few weeks is a biography, we will start with some practice with summarising important information, searching for key words and note-taking.

This week in our SMART Spelling we are learning the digraph /se/ making the sound 's' as in horse. In Literacy we are switching back to reading and writing biographies and hope to publish a biography by Friday. Last week students wrote and performed their speeches either in front of just our class or in front of all 3-6 students and a panel of judges (Miss H, Mrs Nicholls and Ms Taylor). Everyone did a fantastic job! In Mathematics we are starting our subtraction unit and we are focusing on expanding out a number before we subtract it, as this makes it easier for us to subtract bigger numbers.

Round 10 with Magic Magpies

Thursday 15th May

Hot **Suns** hang on over the **Hawks** to keep Darwin streak intact. Just when it looked like the Darwin fortress would be infiltrated, the **Suns** found something in the final quarter to defeat the **Hawks** by **8-points** in a thrilling opener to the Sir Doug Nicholls Round.

Friday 16th May

The **Swans** hosted the **Blues** at the SSG in very wet conditions making it slippery for the players to control the ball by hand and foot. The **Swans** hung on for most of the match as the **Blues** failed to make the most of their early momentum. The home side surged with a 5-goal-to-2 final term in a low scoring contest to clinch the **11.12 (78)** to **9.8 (62)** win.
