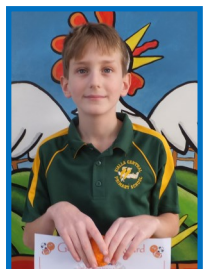

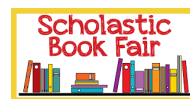

### 5/6 Nicholls

SMART spelling focus this week is the graph /r/ making the 'r' sound as in rain as opposed to the digraph /wr/ making the 'r' sound. We are finishing up some Essential Assessment assignments to provide data around progress in addition and subtraction and assessing how much we know about time. We continue to look at the location of European and Asian countries, checking in with interactive online maps to check what we know. Also in the finishing stages are our biographies which we are presenting as a lapbook, which is a learning experience for most of us. This week in SMART Spelling we are learning the digraph /oy/ making the sound 'oy' as in toy. In Literacy we are note taking and paraphrasing, as well as completing an autobiography about ourselves. In Mathematics we are linking addition and subtraction, focusing on fact families.

We are exploring different texts that share information about jobs that people (or animals) can do. We will be thinking about the skills needed to do a job well. In maths we are exploring doubles and fact families. In spelling we are practicing another split di-graph; i-e. like in kite.

## 2025 K.C.P.S. Footy Tipping Competition

### Round 12 with Magic Magpies

#### Thursday 29th May

The **Lions** overcame another huge scare at the Gabba to outlast the **Bombers** by **18-points** on Thursday night. The **13.12 (90)** to **11.6 (72)** victory momentarily moved the 2024 Premiers into top spot and ensured it will finish round 12 in the top two, but it wasn't easy. The **Lions** led by **32 points** at quarter-time and were doing it with such ease the result looked like a foregone conclusion. But the **Bombers** had other ideas and hit the front early in the final quarter giving the **Lions** a big scare before securing the 4 points.

#### Friday 30th May

The **Magpies** put the young upstart **Hawks** firmly in their place on Friday night in the colosseum, running in waves and knitting together seamlessly to secure a thumping **51-point** victory. The **Magpies** efficiency inside 50 was incredible, with 27 scoring shots from 44 inside 50s, compared to the **Hawks** 16 from 45. **Jamie Elliott** snagged **5 goals** for a second consecutive week to continue his outstanding season. This was the **Hawks** third loss on the trot in the **16.11 (107)** to **8.8 (56)** result.

#### Saturday 31st May

The **Dockers** surged into premiership contention, riding on some Shai Bolton moments to hold on for a thrilling **11-point** win over the **Suns** at a wet People First Stadium on Saturday. The **11.9 (75)** to **9.10 (64)** victory was the **Dockers** third straight and pushes them into the top eight, temporarily at least, with a favourable month to follow their upcoming bye. They survived a last minute scare, with the **Suns** having a chance to level the scores just before the siren sealed the deal.

The **Giants** trailed by **28-points** at the last change but inspired by a team talk from injured **Callan Ward**, finished over the top of a wayward **Tigers** to clinch a **12.8 (80)** to **10.17 (77)** win. The **Tigers** inaccuracy of 17 behinds, ultimately cost them the game. Local boy, **Lachie Ash**, was pivotal to the **Giants** turning the contest around with his run and carry damaging as he gathered game highs of 36 disposals and 793m gained.

A red hot **Crows** outfit has asserted its premiership credentials with a **90-point** demolition of the **Swans** at the SCG. The **Crows** slammed through 12 unanswered goals on their way to a **21.5 (131)** to **5.11 (41)** victory. The **Crows** move to third on the ladder after holding the **Swans** to an embarrassing 1 goal at half time.

#### Sunday 1st June

The **Saints** has kept its season alive by winning in the Northern Territory for the first time ever, led by the **Saints** Indigenous players in a **28-point** win over the **Demons** at TIO Traeger Park. The **Demons** had far more scoring shots but didn't lead at any change, after the **Saints** kicked 6 unanswered goals in the first quarter to put them on a path to the **14.7 (91)** to a very inaccurate **Demons 7.21 (63)** upset win in the Red Centre.

The **Cats** led by just 7-points early in the final quarter with **Eagles** forward **Noah Long** missing an opportunity to close the margin to **one point** just 35m out from a set shot. Long's miss proved costly, as the **Cats** then kicked 7 of the next 8 goals to secure the **17.14 (116)** to **11.7 (73)** win.

This is the first mid-season split round, as a result, the **Blues**, **Kangas**, **Power** and **Bulldogs** all had a bye.

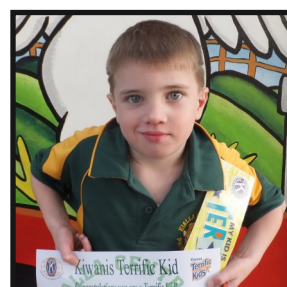
