### 5/6 Nicholls



I have been successfully persuaded by the majority of our class to consider that this week and last week were both short weeks and we should therefore not move onto a new spelling focus. Hence, we are remaining focused on our 'r' words with the graph /R/. It is always good to give weight to student voice and consider valid and sensible ideas. As it is report writing time, there is a focus on completing assessments as they provide a way of showing growth. Our next mathematical study is on Time as we finish our addition and subtraction unit. There will be no further topics until Term 3. We will also design and produce a toilet roll wrapper, locate and describe South East Asian areas and begin either an autobiography, or an information piece on someone students rate. If you are a Grade 6 student, there are 18 more school days until you have finished a whole half year – then it's half a year more until you are high school students.

### 3/4 Taylor

This week in SMART spelling we are learning the difference between the homophones there, their and they're. In Literacy we are note taking and paraphrasing, as well as starting our informational unit. In Mathematics we are starting to learn about time, focusing on matching analogue and digital time.



### 1/2 Daffy



We are in the midst of another busy week! During literacy we are exploring different informative and fictional texts to learn about different occupations, particularly those in our community who help us. We know that you need different skills and strengths to do different jobs and have thought about what we might like to do when we grow up! During spelling we are revising what we have learnt so far this year. In maths we are investigating fractions. We are representing 'out of' in different ways and showing that we understand fractions are divided into equal groups.

### F/1 Mouldsdaile

Our Foundation word of the week is 'yes' and sentence 'Mum and Dad said yes.' The spelling focus is 'ir' as in shirt. In maths we will explore collecting simple sets of data using yes/no answers and how we can depict this data. We will also be completing some assessments so we can celebrate just how much we've learnt this year already!

# 2025 K.C.P.S. Footy Tipping Competition

## Round 13 with Magic Magpies

### Thursday 5th June

The **Hawks** were desperate for a win against the **Bulldogs** after three straight losses and coach **Sam Mitchell** made it quite clear that he expected a more disciplined performance from his troops after poor performances against the **Magpies** and **Lions**. The **Hawks** won the contest, tackles and pressure, banking them the 4 premiership points that has kept them in the top 8. The final score **12.9 (81) to 8.11 (59)**. Mrs O'Donnell had 2 happy **Hawks** and 3x disappointed **Bulldog** supporters on their way home from the game.

### Friday 6th June

The **Crows** pulled off a huge come-from-behind victory against reigning premiers the **Lions**, in a Friday night thriller, defeating the **Lions** by **5-points** in wet and slippery conditions at Adelaide Oval. In a low-scoring, high-pressure affair, the **Crows** kicked 5 unanswered goals in the final quarter to win **10.8 (68) to 8.15 (63)**.

### Saturday 7th June

Following a **90-point** loss at home in round 12, there were some early signs that things might follow that path again this week on the wintery MCG deck. However, the **Swans** flicked the switch and never looked back beating the **Tigers** comfortable by **44-points**. Ten unanswered goals from the **Swans** resulted in the final scores being **11.14 (80)** to a very inaccurate and embarrassing **Tigers 4.12 (36)**.

The **Suns** will have to wait a little longer to break its GMHBA Stadium drought as the **Cats** again proved far too strong with a **24-point** win in the wet of Saturday. The **Cats** were a little too clean, a little too well organised and a little too polished for the **Suns**. The **Cats** ran away with a strong second half to win **9.7 (61) to 5.7 (37)** and entrenched themselves in the top four.

The **Power** snapped a four-game losing streak with a pressure-relieving **16-point** upset over the **Giants** on Saturday night. The **Power**, who have been adamant they wouldn't bring forward plans for Josh Carr to succeed underfire coach **Ken Hinkley** at season's end, fought through a Sam Taylor masterclass to prevail **9.12 (66) to 7.8 (50)** at Manuka Oval in Canberra.

### Sunday 8th June

The **Kangas** are somehow 1-0 at its Bunbury WA home, coming from behind against a wasteful **Eagles** on Sunday to win by **10-points** in a scrappy game that it had looked destined to lose. The **Kangas** Trailed by **18-points** early in the fourth quarter in a 'home' game they had sold to Hands Oval, but they lifted to boot the final three goals of the game to win **9.8 (62) to 6.16 (52)**.

The **Blues** held off a courageous **Bombers** team by 8-points in the King's Birthday Eve thriller in front of a crowd of 74,280 at the MCG. A six-goal-to-one first quarter, set up the game for the **Blues** who dug deep to hold off the fighting **Bombers** to win **11.12 (78) to 11.4 (70)**. The **Bombers** outscored the **Blues** in every other quarter, kicking **10 goals** to the **Blues 5** after quarter time. The **Blues** just hung on against their arch-rivals after almost coughing up a 38-point lead.

### Monday 9th June

The **Magpies** held on for a tightly fought win, seeing off the **Demons** comeback to scrape over the line by **1-point**. It was a scrappy first-half, the Demons found some rare fluency to drag the

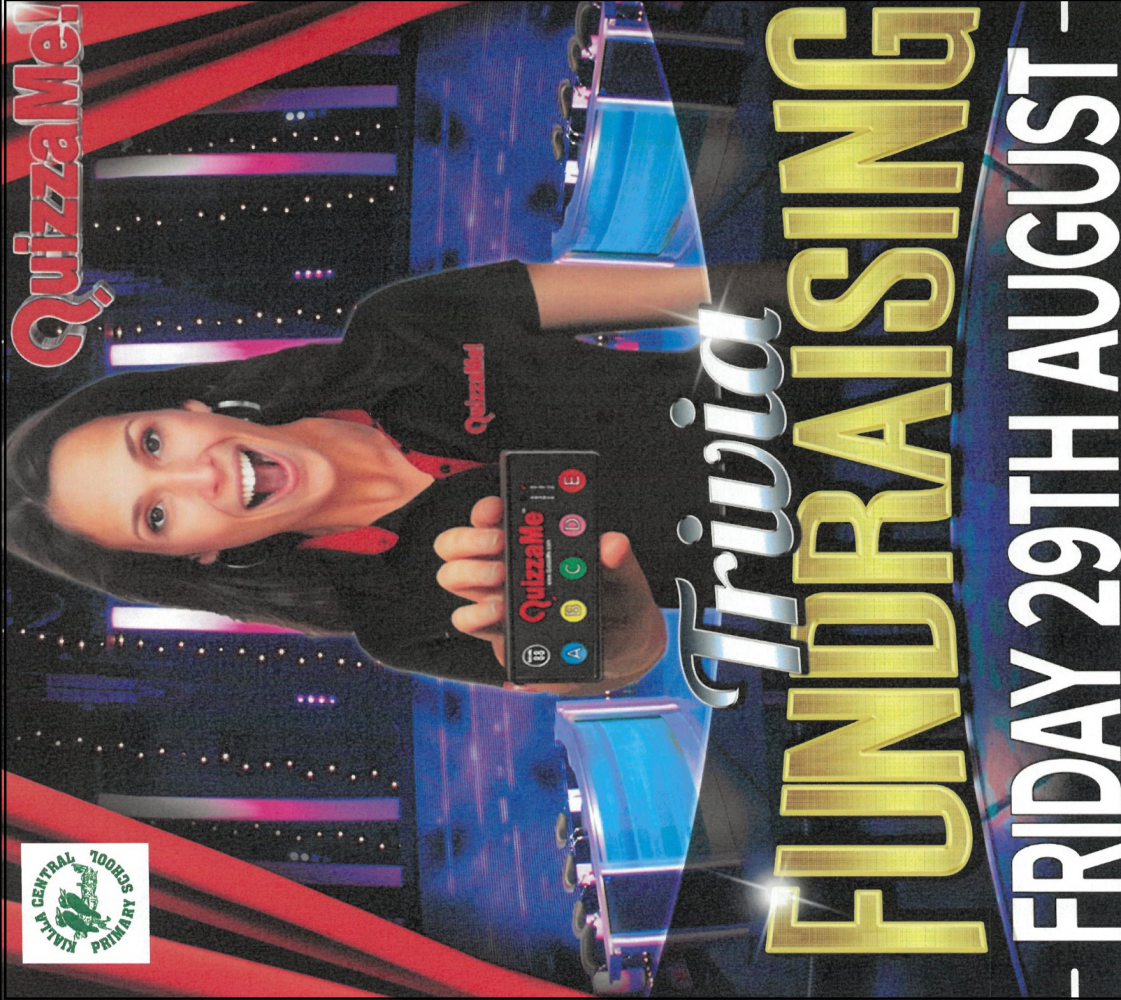

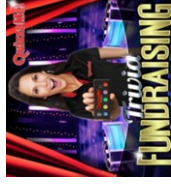
