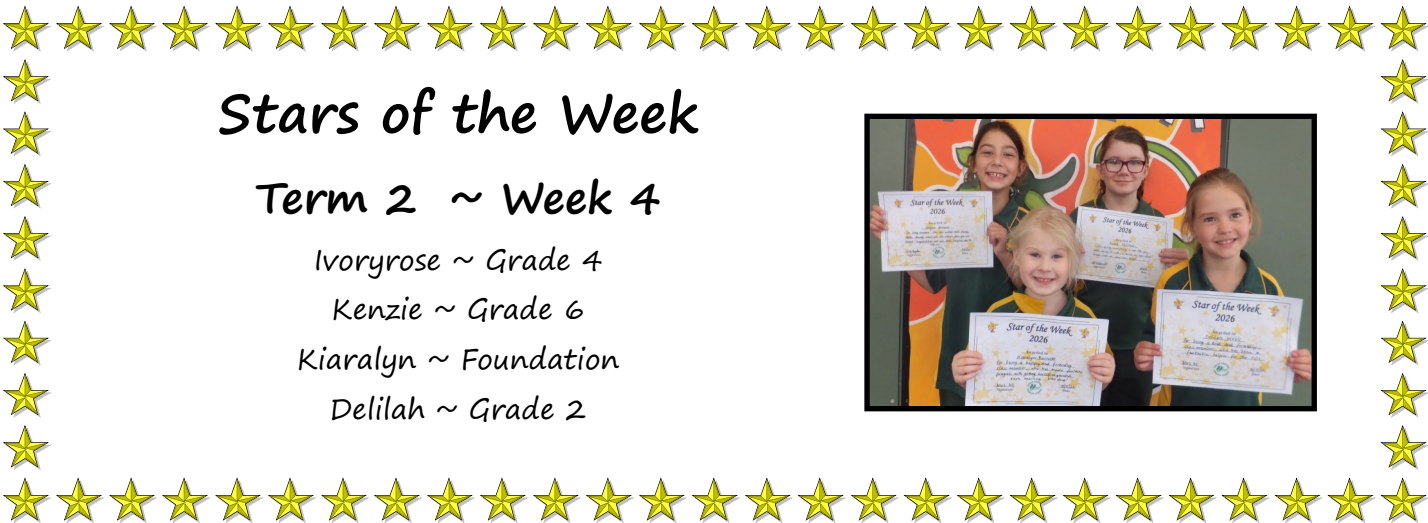

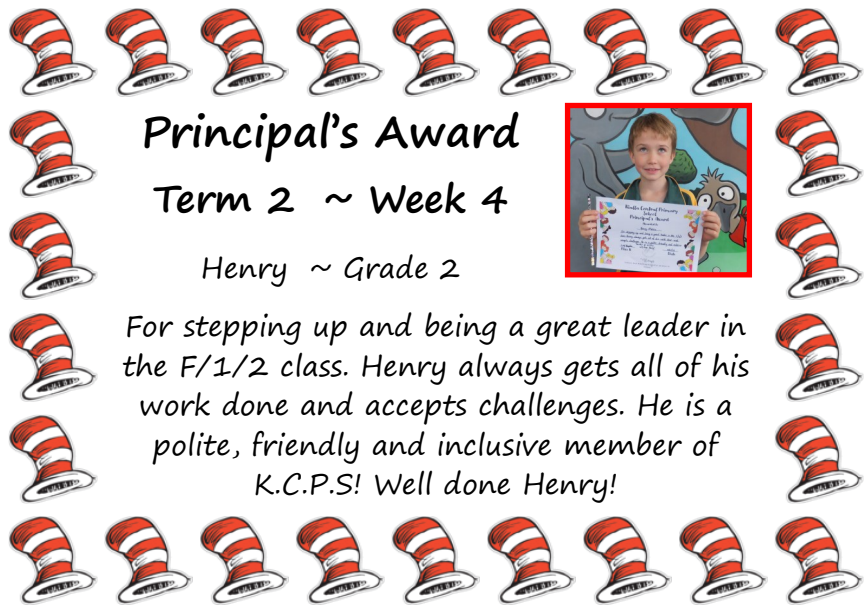

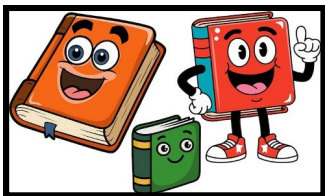

**Education Week** is an annual celebration of public education in Victoria.

In 2026, Victoria celebrates Education Week from **Monday 18 May to Friday 22 May**. This year's theme is **Showcase your school**, encouraging school communities to celebrate what's great about their school. Our students have been sharing what they like about K.C.P.S. The F/1/2 students did posters and were recorded by the 5/6 students, which is going to be made into a short video. The Grade 3 to 6 students have a choice of how they want to present their responses. The choices include: a school advertisement video, a promotional poster, a school tour brochure, a school theme song or jingle, "a day in the life" presentation, a school comedy sketch or role play, a story writing task or a school podcast or radio segment. We look forward to seeing the end result of these projects.



Our students in grade 3 to 6 have been writing and presenting speeches to their peers in preparation for the upcoming Annual Lions Club Public Speaking Competition. The topics this year are:

**Years 3 & 4 ~ 3 minute speech**

If you could go on a holiday anywhere in Australia, where would you go and why?

**Years 5 & 6 ~ 4 minute speech**

If you could have dinner with anyone in the world (a real person past or present), who would it be, and why, and what would you serve them for dinner?

Students have presented their speeches to their peers, in various forms, small groups, 1:1 with their teacher or to the whole class. Students who wish to participate in the Lions Club Competition have presented their speeches to both classes. They are further editing and practising their speech to ensure they confidently deliver their speech and meet the time requirements.

The competition is on **Wednesday 3rd June** at Orrvale Primary School. We have 11 brave students who have put their hand up to

participate in this event. Parent permission notes to enter the competition have been sent home. I am currently working out the logistics of transporting and supervising our students for this event. A second parental permission form will be sent home shortly.

Next **Wednesday 27th May**, we have 4 students participating in the Division Cross Country Championships in Shepparton. On behalf of K.C.P.S. I would like to wish: **Flynn D, Clementine, Jett and Ivoryrose** all the best for the next level of competition. Thank you to their families for organising transport to get their child to and from the event.

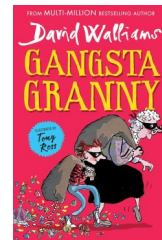
### F/1/2 Mouldsdale

**Thursday 14th May**

**Geelong (117) def Brisbane Lions (76)**

In a role reversal from last year's Grand Final, it was **Geelong** that used the third-quarter avalanche to propel it to a **41-point** thumping of **Brisbane** at the Gabba.

**Friday 15th May**

**Sydney Swans (81) def Collingwood (75)**

**Sydney** unleashed a stunning third-quarter assault to overwhelm a brave but undermanned **Collingwood** by **6-points** at the SCG.

**Gold Coast Suns (98) def Port Adelaide (Yartapuulti) (73)**

The **Gold Coast Suns** completed its perfect 10 in Darwin, holding off **Adelaide** to win by **25-points** and continued an unbeaten 5 seasons in the Top End.

After a tumultuous week that started with the resignation of Michael Voss, after a 7 game losing streak. **Carlton** showed no signs of emotional strain with their fourth quarter blitz over the **Western Bulldogs**.
