### 2025 K.C.P.S. Footy Tipping Competition Round 14 with Magic Magpies

### Thursday 12th June

The **Bulldogs** were fierce against the **Saints** on Thursday night at Marvel Stadium. The **Doggies** ability to release the ball to a runner from the contest was a game breaker. While the **Saints** went with the **Bulldogs** in terms of clearances, it was their second layer that gave them the upper hand. The return of Darcy to the **Bulldogs** made a difference with him contributing 3 goals to the scoreboard, with the final score **20.12** (132) to **8.12** (60). The **Dogs** have now beaten the **Saints** by a combined **143 points** this year.

### Friday 13th June

The battle between the **Hawks** and the **Crows** shaped up to be a game where we would learn a lot about where these 2 sides are at in the race for the finals. We got a hard-fought, inaccurate slog, and it left more questions than answers. Thirteen consecutive behinds were kicked between the two teams across the third and fourth terms, as a number of players failed to take an opportunity to apply scoreboard pressure. ### EXPRESSION OF INTEREST GRAHAMVALE P.S. HOLIDAY PROGRAM





This expression of interest is designed to determine how many of our families would consider using this program, based at Grahamvale P.S. Patsi works at this holiday program.


