Our last week before holidays so we are not starting a new SMART spelling focus. Instead we are looking at words that are plurals; some always plural (like scissors) and some that don't change (like fish and sheep). We are starting a new unit for maths looking at area and perimeter. As pre-testing shows that the general level of knowledge in this subject is pretty high, we only need to clear up a few distinctions between them and so will fit that into this shortened week. Students are finalising their autobiographies to present at Parent/Teacher interviews, and some are honing their chess skills preparing for our Thursday excursion to Gowrie Street's tournament.

Round 16 with Magic Magpies

Thursday 26th June

Things went from bad to worse for **Blues'** coach Michael Voss after his side was thrashed by **50-points** by the **Power** at Adelaide Oval on Thursday night. The **Blues** could only manage to score **1 goal** before half-time, eventually going down **16.14 (110)** to **8.12 (60)** in front of a crowd of 30,381. Imagine the percentage booster if the **Power** had kicked straight ...

Friday 27th June

The **Bulldogs** celebrated Captain **Marcus Bontempelli's 250th** game in style after holding off the **Swans** by **9-points** in a rollercoaster clash on the controversial surface of the SCG. The **Bulldogs** had been left searching for a big scalp after steamrolling sides sitting in the bottom half of the ladder. The **Swans** made the **Bulldogs** work for the win. The lead changed 10 times before the last change, with the final score **16.9 (105)** to **14.12 (96)**.

Saturday 28th June

The **Suns** moved back into the top eight, holding off a spirited final quarter comeback from the **Demons** to win by **19-points** at People First Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The **Dees** were fresh off a bye but looked like they were still in holiday mode early on, as the **Suns** charged to a 36-point quarter time lead on the way to a **15.14 (104)** to **12.13 (85)** win. Yet again accuracy in front of goal was an issue for both teams.

The **23.12 (150)** to **9.11 (65)** victory at University of Tasmania Stadium in Launceston was the **Hawk's** third in a row and ninth in succession at the ground. The **Hawks** increased its lead at each change against the **Kangas** outfit, after they came off an upset win over the **Blues** last week. To add to the **Kangas** woes they couldn't stop veteran Jack Gunston, who kicked a career best **7-goals** helping his team jump into the top 4 on the ladder.

The ladder-leading **Magpies**, now 10 points clear of the second-placed **Lions**, had to claw and fight for the **29-point** victory over the cellar dweller **Eagles** on Saturday night. The **Eagles** work ethic was unquestioned, but ultimately the class of the **Magpies** led to the **13.10 (88)** to **8.11 (59)** victory in its second Marvel Stadium home game of the season. **Scott Pendlebury** and **Darcy Cameron** got the **Pies** moving out of the middle which saw the **Magpies** get the job done.

Sunday 29th June

As expected, the **Crows** comfortably accounted for the struggling **Tigers**, marking everything that came their way in a thumping **68-point** victory to jump into third spot on the ladder. It was also expected that the **Tigers'** **Tom Lynch** would lose his cool at some point, but his full blown punch came out of left-field in the **18.14 (122)** to **8.6 (54)** loss. The ramifications for **Lynch's** behaviour will unfold over the coming weeks.

The **Dockers** lifted late to hold off a determined **Saints** side at Optus Oval, extending their winning run to 6 games in a Sunday thriller that went down to the wire. Eight weeks after one of the **Dockers** worst defeats, they were challenged in the midfield again and trailed early in the final term before kicking five of the last six goals to win **11.15 (81)** to **9.15 (69)**.

5 tips to keep your family safe online



Parents and carers can use a combination of strategies to help young people build their digital technology skills and have safer experiences online.

1. Start the chat

Get into the habit of talking about online safety as a family, so your child feels comfortable coming to you if they ever need help working out an issue. It's never too early to introduce [good online habits](#) such as respect, empathy, critical thinking, responsible behaviour and resilience. As your child grows older, eSafety's advice about [hard to have conversations](#) will help with some of the tricky topics like sending nudes, online pornography and contact from sexual predators.

2. Create a family technology agreement

Creating a Family Technology Agreement can help you and your kids decide together when and how digital technology will be used at home. As a family, brainstorm easy-to-follow rules and display them where everyone will see them. Your agreement could cover things like: time limits, apps your kids are allowed to use and online behaviour. Families with younger children can [download](#) a template to guide the conversation.

3. Set up parental controls

Parental controls let you monitor and limit what your child sees and does online. It's best to use them in combination with the other online safety strategies listed here. [Taming the technology](#) can help you understand your options. Grab a device and get started with our guides to setting up parental controls on [devices and accounts](#) or in [social media, games and apps](#).

4. Choose games and other apps carefully

Use eSafety's [App checklist for parents](#) to think about the positives and negatives when your child asks to download a new game or other app. The checklist covers things like age ratings, managing privacy settings and reporting abuse in-app. You can also use [The eSafety guide](#) to check and set up safety features with your child.

5. Use digital technology together

Exploring or playing on devices or online with your child can be a positive experience that promotes learning and development. Ask questions, be curious and get involved. To learn more, read our blogpost [How to encourage good screen practices for your child](#).
