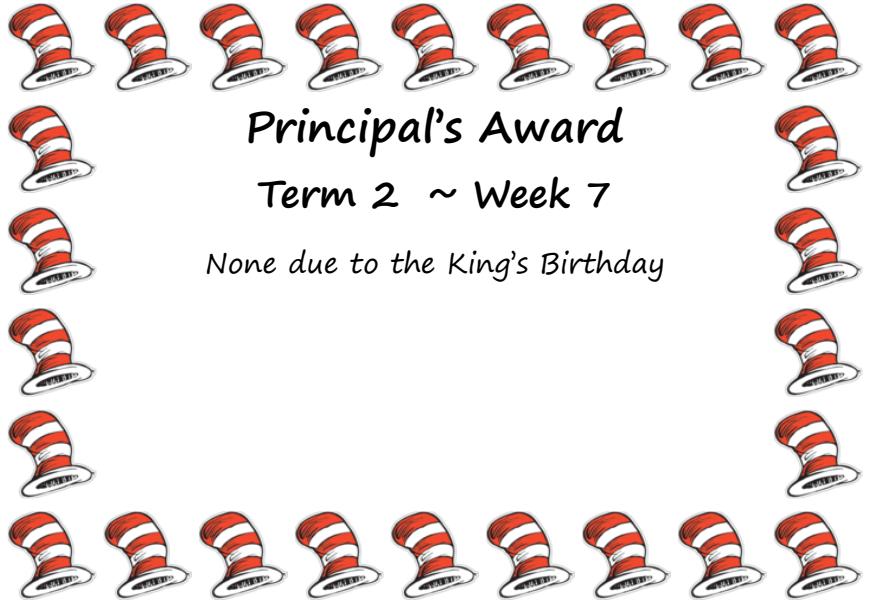

I trust that everyone enjoyed their extra long weekend and made the most of some sunshine.

Our Curriculum Day on Friday was a **report writing day** for the teachers. There is a lot of time, effort and thought that goes into writing a report. At Kialla Central Primary School, we don't have comment boxes that teachers just cut and paste, we actually write them all individually and from scratch. Obviously there are some similarities between reports based on the Victorian Curriculum we are mandated to teach.

Once teachers have written their class reports, the specialists comments and progression points are dropped in as well as the extra-curricular activities. They are proof read by another teacher before landing on my desk to be proof read again. Any changes are made and formatting is checked before they are uploaded and released on COMPASS. Reports will be available on **Tuesday 23rd June**. Foundation students receive a printed copy of their first school report which is put in their K.C.P.S. keepsake display folder.

Our reports go through quite a process involving all staff from the teachers writing them, to **Tracey Opie** setting up the new display folders and **Lisa Irwin** building the report format and uploading the reports onto **COMPASS** for our families to access. I encourage you to take the time to read your child/ren's report with them to celebrate their achievements.

Recently our Grade 4 to 6 students participated in the **2026 Student Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS)**, which all government school students in Years 4 to 12 were invited to complete.

The AtoSS is a voluntary student survey offered by the Department of Education every year to help schools and the department understand students' experiences of school. Students were asked about their thoughts and feelings about their school, their learning, relationships with other students, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

ORIMA Research Pty Ltd has been contracted by the department to manage the collection of the online survey. Thank you to all of our students who completed this survey.

On Tuesday we had our school photos taken with **MSP photography**. It was great to see some new haircuts, fancy hair styles, clean faces and new uniform make an appearance for our photos. The weather gods certainly challenged us early on as the rain looked like it had set in for most of the morning. Our SMART Foundation word of the week is 'vet' and sentence 'The vet will see your pet.' The Grade 1 SMART Spelling focus has been 'ou' as in house. The students have really enjoyed having their pets in the classroom this week especially in reading time. In maths we have celebrating everything we have learnt this year through learning assessments.

We are exploring onomatopoeia, adjectives and syllables in the lead up to creating our own poems. Our maths focus is fractions. In reading, we are enjoying using Reading Coach as one of our rotations. In Maths, we are finishing off subtraction in number and continuing working on time with Mr Z. In Humanities, this term with a Geography focus we have been looking at 'Australia and our neighbours', we have been discussing climate and the impacts it has.

Adelaide (75) def Geelong (74): The Crows held off the Cats in a thriller at the Adelaide Oval. Captain Jordan Dawson starred for the home team but the win has come at a cost, with injuries to Ah Chee and Butts.
