## ~ CLASSROOM WRAP ~

### F/1/2 Mouldsdale

Our SMART Foundation word of the week is 'car' and sentence 'We must park the car down here.' The Grade 1's SMART Spelling focus is /ar/ as in car. In maths we are investigating 2D shapes. The Year 1 students are extending their knowledge by using the different 2D shapes to make quarter, half and three-quarter turns. This time of year is exciting as students begin to more independently demonstrate just how much they have already learnt.



### 2 Daffy

**FRACTION** We are continuing our work on poetry, learning about different types of words, different kinds of poems and experimenting with writing our own. Our SMART Spelling focus this week is high frequency words that still trick us. Most of them have a tricky part that we need to remember, like the 'a' in 'after'. In maths we are extending our knowledge of fractions and representing what we know in different ways



### 3/4 Humphries/Zito

Our focus for spelling for this week and next week are the states, territories and capital cities of Australia. This week's spelling test will be the capital cities. In Reading our theme is the Men's World Cup and with various activities to complete from mapping to player profiles. For writing, we have used a chatterbox to give us a hero, villain and problem to help us plan and then write an engaging story. In Maths, our focus in number is money and time in applied.



### 5/6 O'Donnell

5/6 SMART Spelling Focus this week is the 'et' and 'ai' making /a/ as in ballet. We are almost finished reading our class text, 'Wonder'. We will be watching the movie next week to finish off the term. Please let me know if you have any concerns. The students are very excited to compare the differences between the book and the movie. In Maths we are looking at Time; 12- and 24-hour time, as well as revisiting the connection between analogue and digital clocks.

Recently there seems to be an increase in the number of students that are eating their lunch at recess, saying they were still hungry, leaving them with nothing to eat at lunchtime. Please check with your child/ren and see if this relates to them. It could be worthwhile packing some extra snacks or 2 sandwiches (one for recess and one for lunch) to help keep up with their growing bodies. Let's have a great last week of Semester One!
