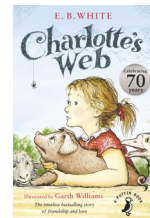

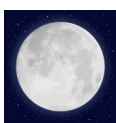
Our mathematicians this week are learning about the split strategy for mentally solving multiplication problems, like 32×5 is 30×5 and 2×5 . SMART Spelling has us looking at the suffix 'able'. Did you know there are over 900 words with the vowel suffix 'able', but only 200 with 'ible'? We are thinking about National Tree Planting Day in sustainability and preparing for our One Child One Tree planting day later this term

This week in our SMART Spelling we are learning the graph 'g' making the sound 'j' as in giant. In Literacy we are continuing our persuasive unit where we are writing persuasive texts about the things we like/dislike. Our mentor text for this term is Charlotte's Web. In Mathematics we are learning about multiplication. Students are learning to represent multiplication equations, using 'groups of' and 'repeated addition'.

This week in SMART Spelling we are exploring the /oo/ diagraph like in moon. In literacy we are discovering more interesting vocabulary and practising using descriptive language in our writing. Our maths focus is on multiplication, identifying skip counting patterns (particularly by 2, 10 and 5). We begin our Integrated Learning unit with Mrs M's class this week too. This term we are exploring change between the past and present.

Round 20 with Magic Magpies

Thursday 24th July

The **Hawks** put on a show early to spoil the **Doherty Blues** great's farewell party. The **Hawks** are young, exciting and watchable, where as the **Blues** are flagging, listless and playing without confidence. The **Hawks 13.7 (85)** to the **Blues 9.7 (61)** took the 4 premiership points securing their position in the top 8.

Friday 25th July

The **Bulldogs** had a night out, beating the **Bombers** by **93-points** at Marvel Stadium. The win puts the **Bulldogs** back in the top 8, as they take another step forward in their race to make the finals after winning **22.11 (143)** to the **Doggies 7.8 (50)** in front of a dismal crowd of only 29,367. Hmmm it has been no commentary from the Bombers hanger ... **Bomber 10** and **Bombing Bomber** very quiet indeed.

There was a second Friday night game, a Sydney derby between the **Giants** and the **Swans** at Engie Stadium. The **Swans** were well down the path to claiming a sixth consecutive win against the **Giants** as they led by as much as 35-points late in the second term. However, that's where things stopped for the **Swans** as the **Giants** unleashed an incredible 11-goal blitz to clinch a **15.12 (102)** to **8.10 (58)** victory.

Saturday 26th July

The **Suns** bossed the **Lions** at the contest and rained goal down in the wet at People First Stadium to win the **QClash** by a record **66-points**. It was the **Suns** 12th win of the season, the most in the club's history and was also a record margin against the **Lions**. On a day that started as light drizzle and progressed to poring rain early in the second half, the Suns were too physical, too clean and too skilled winning **20.10 (130)** to **9.10 (64)**. The **Lions** recent form has silenced **The Banana Bender up there in Toowoomba!**

There was another derby on Saturday afternoon but this time over at **Optus Oval** in Perth, where the **Dockers** played host to the **Eagles**. The **Dockers** asserted its authority controlling a spiteful derby continuing their recent dominance over their rivals the **Eagles**. Final score **Dockers 18.18 (126)** to the **Eagles 12.5 (77)** .

On Saturday night the **Kangas** hosted the **Cats** at Marvel Stadium. The **Cats** completely tore the **Kangas** apart in a **101-point** win, with **Jeremy Cameron** kicking **11 goals** outscoring the **Kangas** off his own boot. The **Cats 22.18 (150)** to the **Kangas 7.7 (49)**.

There was also a second game on Saturday night and another derby this time in Adelaide where the **Crows** hosted the **Power**. The **Crows** literally rained on **Power's** and **Ken Hinkley's** parade, demolishing them by **98-points** in the coach's last showdown at Adelaide Oval. The **Crows** collecting the 4 premiership points with a **20.13 (133)** to **5.5 (35)** victory over the **Power**.

Sunday 27th July

Magic Magpies was very excited as she braved the wintery weather to watch her beloved **Magpies** take on **FOPE's Tigers** at the MCG on Sunday afternoon. The Magpies led at every change and won comfortably in the end. In the third quarter the Pies kicked 5 unanswered goals in 20 minutes to finally end the Tigers' gallant challenge. Final score **13.15 (93)** to **8.9 (57)**.

- encourages them to talk with them if they have issues

- learns about their gaming interests and how it benefits them.

How to have better conversations with children about gaming

What kids hear you say: 'I really don't like that game. Why don't you go find something better to do with your time?'

What we know: Children learn and grow through play. As a form of play, gaming offers a range of benefits. When children see their gaming is valued, they are more likely to share their experiences – both positive and negative.

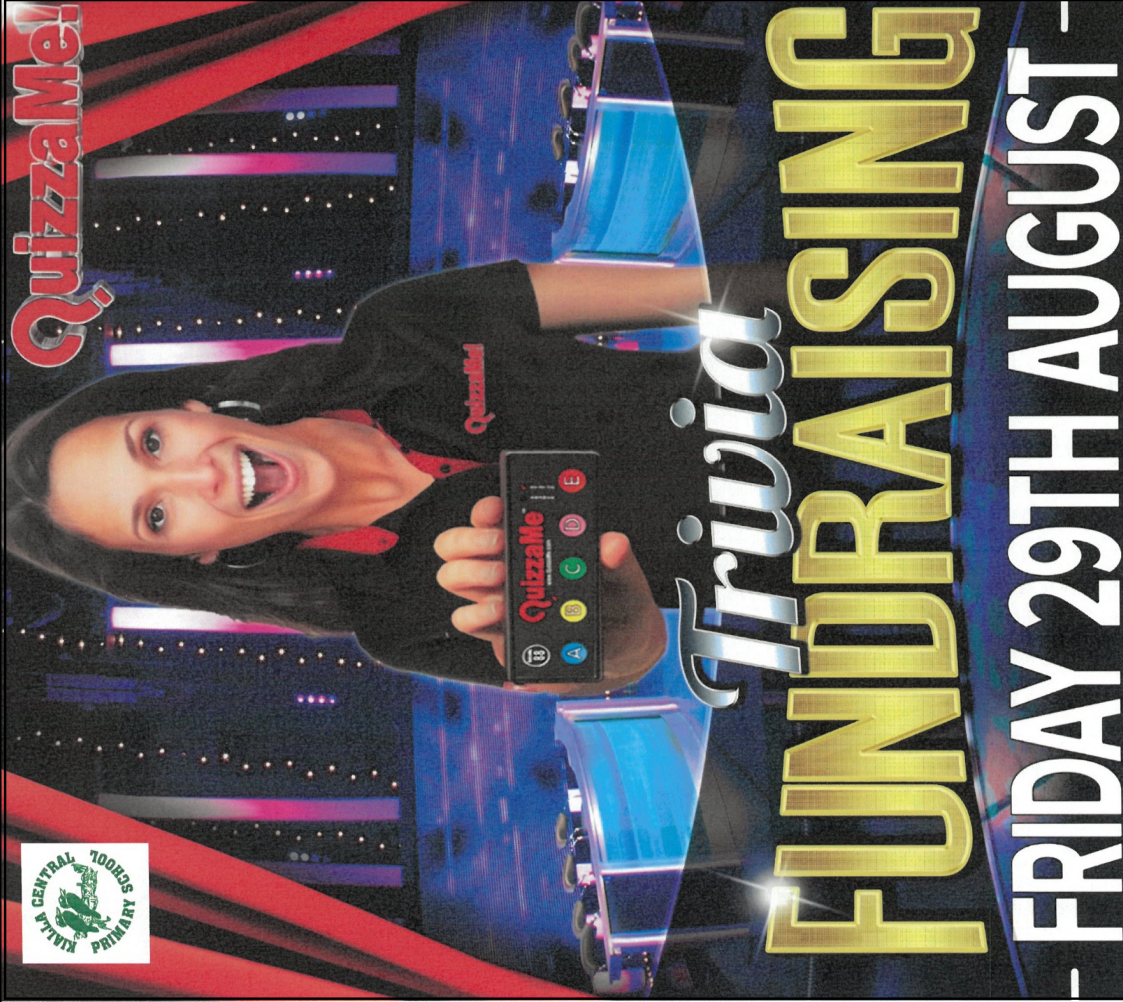
Better conversations sound like: 'I can see you really enjoy that game. What do you like about it?'
