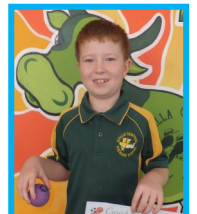

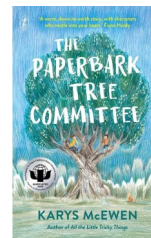
2 Daffy



We have hit the ground running and made a wonderful start to our new semester. In English we are exploring procedural texts. This week we are focusing on verbs and 'when words', identifying them in various texts and including them in our writing. Our maths focus is Time. We know there are lots of ways of measuring time, from milliseconds to centuries, and have been learning how to tell the time on an analogue and digital clock. Our understanding of fractions is helping us identify half past, quarter past and quarter to the hour.

Blitz Master is back as our fluency task and we are increasing our knowledge about multiplication!

We are looking forward to having Miss Baker join us for this Semester. 5/6 SMART Spelling focus this week is the digraph /si/ making 'zh.' Our writing has been some fun creative writing topics based on our holidays. Some topics include Would you rather, My holidays in 5 words and Holiday Award nominations. In maths we are looking at Multiplication; looking at how important our times tables are, and also what strategies we can use to solve more difficult multiplication equations. Lots of learning to come so let's all have a great Term 3!



FOOTY WRAP Rounds 16-18 with G-Towner

Adelaide: The Crows had a disappointing loss to cross town rivals Port, a win in the west over the Eagles, and a day out against the hapless Suns, winning by 79 points.

Brisbane: The Lions have had a ripper 3 weeks, taking down Sydney, Geelong and then Essendon. They are on a roll.

Carlton: The Blues' winning run continued against West Coast and in a thriller against Richmond before Hawthorn grabbed the points in a big win at the G in Round 18.

Collingwood: The Pies have managed 3 wins, although there have been a couple of close ones. In Round 17 they beat the Suns by 6 points and in Round 18 they surged home late to beat the Roos by 4.

Essendon: The Bombers were competitive against North but went down by 14 points. They were then defeated comprehensively by St Kilda and then Brisbane.

Fremantle: The week after holding the Suns to only 29 in Round 16 the Dockers recorded their second loss of the season, going down to GWS before returning to the winners list against Sydney.

Geelong: After a Round 16 bye the Cats have experienced back to back losses; to Brisbane and then GWS where they gave up a sizeable 3 quarter time lead.

Gold Coast: It has been a tough 3 rounds for the Suns. They were only able to kick 3 goals against Fremantle, lost a close one to Collingwood and had a game to forget against the Crows.

GWS: The Giants lost to Hawthorn and then hit a vein of form, toppling the ladder leading Dockers and then storming home against Geelong.

Hawthorn: There have been mixed results for the Hawks. They played well against GWS, lost to Melbourne in Launceston and brought Carlton's run to an end with a 10 goal win.

Melbourne: The Dees came off a bye to record a 35 point win against the Hawks and followed up with an easy win against Richmond.

North Melbourne: The Roos celebrated a good win against Essendon, fell to Port the following week and lost a heartbreaker at Marvel against Collingwood.

Port Adelaide: The Power recorded a morale boosting win against Adelaide, and backed up by defeating North Melbourne. St Kilda had their measure in Round 18.

Richmond: The Tiges have been unable to add to their 2 wins of the season, with losses against Collingwood and Melbourne. They came within 2 points of Carlton in Round 17.

St Kilda: The past 3 rounds have brought mixed results for the Saints. They went down to the Doggies by 22, recorded a comprehensive win over Essendon and snuck home in a close one against Port.

Sydney: The Swannies were defeated by Brisbane at the Gabba but bounced back against the Dogs. Despite holding Freo goalless in the first half of their Round 18 clash they were down by 38 points at the final siren.

West Coast: Despite being competitive the Eagles are struggling to get points on the board. They recorded losses against Carlton, Adelaide and the Western Bulldogs.

Western Bulldogs: A Round 16 bye was followed by a loss to Sydney and a 16 point win over the Eagles.

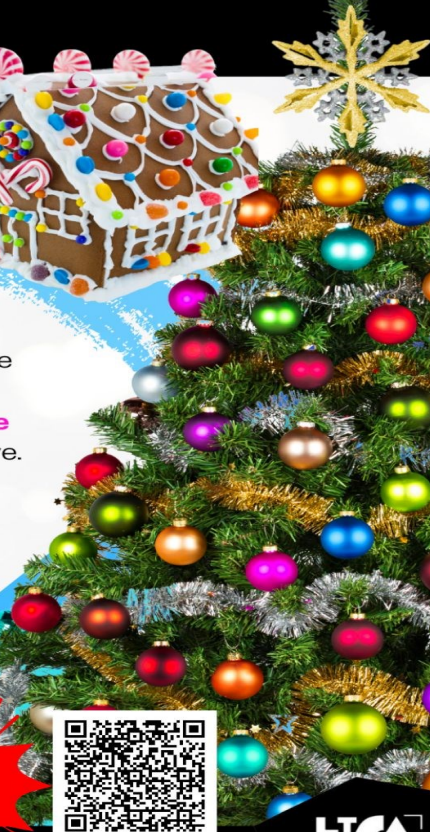
