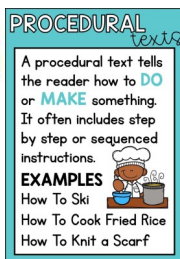

The SMART Foundation word of the week is 'shark' and sentences 'She could see a shark. It was over by the ship.' The SMART Spelling focus is /ar/ as in shark. In maths we have moved from shape, colour and picture patterns to number patterns. We have been skip counting by 2s.

This week our SMART Spelling focus is the digraph /ou/ like in house. We are continuing to explore procedural texts. We know that formal procedures have a title and a list of ingredients or materials. We find the steps (which include verbs and when words) in the method. We are writing our own procedures. In maths we are reading times on digital clocks and matching them to analogue clock times. It is helping to use red for the hours and blue for the minutes.

Our SMART Spelling focus this week is the graph /q/ making the 'k' sound as in queen. Our class novel is 'The Paperbark Tree Committee' has been short listed for this year's Book of the Year Awards. For writing we are doing poetry, looking at Acrostic and Shape poems. Maths for number we are looking at multiplication and in applied maths with Mr Z we are looking at perimeter.
