On Tuesday our Mrs Mouldsdales's F/1 Grade celebrated being at school for 100 days. This was a fun day which recognizes the amazing progress our Foundations students make in their first 100 days at school. Thank you to our families for supporting this event as well as Mrs M and Mrs Blake.

On Friday 31st July we are participating in the Plant a Tree Day and doing some gardening around our school. We have teamed up again with City of Greater Shepparton's Sustainability and Environment Division for this initiative. Each grade has been allocated an area that they will be responsible for to either plant some new plants or do some general gardening. This will be an out of uniform day where students wear gardening/old clothes, bring an old pair of shoes or boots for your gardening session. It will be a busy day but one that will make a difference to the appearance of our school.



There has been a significant decline in the number of lunch orders with Fiore's Bakery and Café. As a result, after this week there will be no lunch orders on Fridays until further notice. With our recent Pie Drive and hot lunches on Tuesdays and Thursdays this service is not viable, for Mrs O and Fiore's to do. We will re-visit this option in Term 4 when our hot lunches stop. Thanks to Mrs O and for your support of this initiative.

We have announced our 2026 whole school excursion to the Indoor Bike Park Bentleigh East. This is a fantastic opportunity for all of our students as it caters for everyone's abilities, from those who don't know how to ride a bike to our more experienced thrill seekers. All equipment is supplied and there are multiple experienced coaches on hand throughout the day to ensure all students are engaged, challenged and most importantly safe.



With regard to payment of \$60 per student for this excursion, some families have CSEF and or SSB credit that can be used. Alternatively, you can set up a payment plan to pay it off over an agreed period of time. Lisa Irwin will be able to help you with payment options. However, Lisa will not be in the office until next Wednesday 5th August. We have been able to subsidise this excursion by contributing \$2,000 towards the buses, making it

affordable for our families. Each year there is an enormous amount of thought, research and organisation that goes into our whole school excursions. We aim to offer 7 different excursion experiences over the 7 years that students attend K.C.P.S. If you have any questions or concerns please discuss them with your child's classroom teacher. The cost of excursions is based on all students going, however, we understand that there are some exceptional circumstances.



All schools must participate in a school review every 4 years. The school review informs the development of the school's 4-year School Strategic Plan. The process for school reviews changes with each four year cycle. The current review process has had the most significant changes to how it is facilitated. We are in a review year as we come to the end of our current Strategic Plan. This cycle we only have one day, Thursday 20th August.

The review panel consists of an external reviewer Julie Murkins, the Senior Education Improvement Leader Claire Kelly, Challenge Partners (principals) Wes Teague and David Brodie, School Council President Ricky Myers, 1 or 2 staff members and myself. I believe school reviews are a positive professional learning experience because we are given time to celebrate our successes, external people provide feedback on our school performance/practices and we plan for the future. Last semester we successfully completed our Child Safety Standards Compliance Review, this is the first part of the review process.

Our SMART Spelling focus this week is a split digraph; i_e like in kite. The i and e work together to make the long vowel sound but they are split by another letter. Our literacy focus is procedural texts and we are exploring more formal procedures like recipes and experiments that always have a title and list of what is needed at the top. In maths we are learning more about multiplication. We are beginning our unit by showing what we already know, and practicing skip counting patterns.

Our SMART Spelling focus this week is graph /a/ making the 'a' sound as in baby. In writing we are finishing our poetry unit as we collate our poetry books. We have been learning about the Commonwealth Games as one of our reading rotations. We are enjoying our class novel is 'The Paperbark Tree Committee'. In Maths we are doing Blitz Master which is a program to support the growth of times tables and number facts. Students work independently at their own level, with a 90% accuracy rate required before moving up to the next level. In Humanities, we are investigating our community and celebrations.

5/6 SMART Spelling focus this week is words ending in -ible as in edible. In these words, the letter /l/ is making the sound 'eh' and the letter /e/ is making the sound 'l.' We are investigating the Commonwealth Games with our tasks in reading, writing and design focused on this. We will continue to study this and follow along with any medals won. Go Aussies!! In maths we are moving into Division; looking at the connections between division and multiplication and what strategies we can use to help us solve division equations. We have also introduced Blitzmaster into our Maths sessions. Students work their way through various levels, with a different focus for different levels. Students are awarded gold star stickers to record their success, which is displayed in the room. Have a great week!
