




Schools receive a condition assessment report as part of their Rolling Facilities Evaluation (RFE), every 4 years. This report identifies defects at the school via a visual assessment, listed by priority. Planned maintenance program funding is allocated in response to the RFE, specifically for defects required to be addressed within the next 6 or 12 months (priority 1 and 2 respectively). This includes defects requiring further investigation by the Victorian Schools Building Authority.

2025 K.C.P.S. Footy Tipping Competition Round 24 with Magic Magpies

We are at the end of another AFL Home and Away Season. There has been 24 weeks of banter, celebrations, jackpot winners and some difficult weeks for the avid footy tipper. This year our Footy Tipping Competition has seen quite a battle for positions especially the top end of the ladder which has provided lots of interest.

On behalf of Kialla Central Primary School I would like to sincerely thank you for your support to ensure this long standing tradition continues.

I am aware that there is still one game outstanding in this round, due to a re-scheduling of the **Suns** and **Bombers** game from earlier in the season. However, I will do my usual wrap for the games that have been played. The outstanding game will be included in next week's newsletter which will give us the final results of our **2025 K.C.P.S. Footy Tipping Competition.** There are no jackpot winners for Round 24 so these funds go into the end of year prizes. Our official Footy Tipping presentations will happen on the last day of school, Friday 19th September, as part of our Footy Hotdog Day.

Our official tipping finishes at the end of the home and away season, however, if you want to continue to tip the finals series for fun, you can still do so on the ESPN app.

Thursday 21st August

A drama-filled season has ended on a high note for the **Blues** with a **34-point** win over the **Bombers** in an error laden spectacular at the MCG. The **Blues** ran out **13.12 (90)** to **8.8 (56)** winners on a chilly Thursday night to consign the **Bombers** to a 12th consecutive loss, their worse streak since 2016. The **Blues** will finished 11th and the **Bombers** 15th on the ladder. Even if the **Bombers** pull of the upset for the season against the **Suns** they will remain in 15th position due to a lower percentage than the **Demons**.

Friday 22nd August

The **Magpies** clinched a top-four finish, after winning in a nailbiter against the **Demons.** The **Pies** won by **6-points** on Friday night at the MCG before seeing the Suns fall to the Power. The **Magpies** survived a scare from a gutsy **Demons** side who came into the game with nothing to lose, coming from behind to win **11.16** (**82**) to **11.10** (**76**) in front of a crowd of 60,611. The **Demons** finished in 14th position on the ladder while the **Magpies** held on to their double chance finishing 4th.

The **Suns** finals hopes hang by a thread after suffering an upset **4-point** loss to an emotionally charged **Power** on Friday night. The **Power** farewelled departing coach **Ken Hinkley** and retiring great **Travis Boak** with a **10.11 (71)** to **9.13 (67)** victory in an Adelaide Oval thriller. The result leaves the **Suns** needing to beat the **Bombers** on Wednesday night in the last home and away game of the season to secure a maiden finals birth. While **Power** finished 13th on the AFL ladder for 2025.

Saturday 23rd August

The **Crows** edged past a determined **Kangas** side to clinch the minor premiership. The **Crows** put a tumultuous week behind them posting a **13-point** win over the **Kangas** without **Izak Rankine.** The top of the ladder **Crows** claimed a **17.11** (**113**) to **15.10** (**100**) victory, over the **16th** place **Kangas** at Marvel Stadium.

The Cats secured second spot on the ladder with a comprehensive 39-point win over the Tigers at the MCG on Saturday afternoon. The Cats led at every break to win easily over the 17th placed Tigers 14.19 (103) to 9.10 (64) in front of a crowd of 46,109. It was lucky for the Tiges that the Cats were inaccurate in front of goals. It has been a tough season for the Tigers faithful despite having glimpses of hope for what the young cubs have in store for the future.

The fast finishing **Swans** hammered the final nail into the **Eagle's** worst-ever season. The **Swans** coach **Dean Cox** was forced to deliver a good old fashion spray at quarter-time to spark his team into action. It certainly did the job as the **Swans** stepped up sealing a **67-point** win to the wooden spooners. Final score **18.10** (**118**) to **7.9** (**51**).

Sunday 24th August

The **Giants** held their nerve to fend off the **Saints** taking the four points and securing a home final. The **Giants** booted four of the last five goals to be all but certain to host an elimination final, while clinging onto a faint hope of snatching a double chance with a **15.14 (104)** to **14.9 (93)** win against the **Saints** on Sunday.

The **Dockers** will return to September action for the first time since 2022 after beating the **Bulldogs** by **15-points** at Marvel Stadium. After recovering from a sluggish start the **Dockers** gained control in the second-quarter to surge towards a **17.10** (**112**) to **14.13** (**97**) victory in one of the most important home and away wins in the club's history.

The **Lions** overcame their goalkicking yips to grab a finals double chance, defeating the **Hawks** for a tense **10-point** win at a packed Gabba on Sunday night. In an ideal dress rehearsal for September, the **Lions' 11.23 (89)** to **11.13 (79)** win ensures they finish in 3rd place and face the **Cats** in a qualifying final at the MCG in two weeks.

Star Tippers of the for Round 24: Emma Kay, G-Towners, Henry Myers, Jac Collins, Magic Magpies, Speaky Magee 35, all picked 8 winners with a final game outstanding. The rest of the field picked 7 and 6 winners which shuffled a few positions on the leaderboard. A more detailed report on our tippers will be in next week's newsletter.

Your child's first smartphone - are they old enough?

Children often have access to devices, including smartphones, from a very young age. Whether it's watching their favourite program through streaming services on your phone, using educational apps or simply viewing photos with you and the family, they are engaging with devices in one form or another.

But when is my child old enough to be given their own mobile phone?

In 2012, the Australian Bureau of Statistics revealed children as young as five years old owned a mobile phone – two percent of children aged between five and eight years old, and 29 percent for children aged five to 14 years. This figure is likely to be higher now!

For many parents and carers, five years old would seem too young. For others, it might offer them peace of mind and security to know they can keep in touch with their child—especially in an emergency.

The right age for your child will depend on their level of maturity. It's worth asking yourself the following questions before handing over a digital device.

- Does my child have a good sense of responsibility?
- Are they able to stick to the rules?
- Do they show a good understanding of actions and consequences?
- Do they come to me or another trusted adult when they are distressed or encounter problems?




For younger children it's best to start with a mobile phone without internet access, and introduce a smartphone when they demonstrate an appropriate level of maturity. Some younger children might argue that they are ready for a smartphone, especially if their friends already have one. But it's worth holding out until you feel confident that your child is mature enough.

My child has their first smartphone – now what?

When your child receives their first smartphone it's a great opportunity to instil safe online behaviours early on, so they can carry these skills through to their teens and beyond.

Here are some tips for getting them on board with good online habits.



Talk about expectations and the consequences for not meeting these rules. Depending on the age of your child, you might want to set up a written signed agreement which lists the rules.

Here are some you may want to agree on:

- No phones after a certain time
 (i.e. 8.00 pm) unless in an emergency.
- Keep to daily screen time limits (i.e. 1 hour per school night).
- Family time is a no-phone zone (i.e. dinner).

- Do not share your passwords with others - apart from parents.
- Do not share your real name (or full name), age and address when posting, talking to strangers or on sites where anyone can see it.
- · Be kind to people treat people on the phone as you would face-to-face.
- · Do not take or share photos of others (including friends) without their permission.
- · Tell a parent or another trusted adult if anything makes you feel uncomfortable, or if a stranger contacts you online.
- · Do not purchase or download an app or game without talking to a parent first-especially as these often have minimum age requirements.

Use technology tools to help set the boundaries to keep your child safe

Use parental controls to help manage your child's device and the types of content they can access. Most devices come with parental controls and offer a range of features:

- iPhone: Go to Settings > General > Restrictions. Here you can disable apps or features, prevent access to explicit content and specific webpages.
- · Android (Google Play): Go to Play Store > Settings > Parental controls. Most Android phones use Google Play as the digital marketplace for purchasing apps and accessing content. Through Google Play you can restrict the content your child can download or purchase from Google Play.
- · Google's Family Link is an app for parents to help manage their child's device and account and offers additional layers of protection. It enables parents to set screen time limits, review app permissions (such as their camera, location, contacts), block apps and approve downloads, block sites and filter content.
- You can also check with your mobile service provider if they offer any parental control tools.

Activate any privacy settings and safety features available on the device, in web browsers and apps. In some cases you can do this through parental controls or when installing apps on their phone. Carefully consider permissions and whether apps really need to access your child's location, contact list, messages and other features.

Help your child set up a pin or password to lock their phone. In addition to protecting their personal information, this will ensure that no one else can use their phone.

Help your child set up strong and unique passwords for their apps and websites. Even if the phone is locked, apps and websites can be accessed from other devices.



Communicate openly with your child, establish and maintain trust

Most importantly, communicate openly with your child about their phone and online use. It's not possible to supervise your child 24/7 and no technology tool is 100 percent effective in protecting them from online risks. So it's really important to establish and maintain trust.

- · Talk openly and regularly with your child about their online activities. Show them that you are interested in how they connect with friends, who they talk with and the type of sites they visit.
- · If you are using parental controls, be upfront about this and get them on board. Let them know that these can be reviewed and changed as they get older and they continue to demonstrate responsible behaviour.
- · Talk about positive online behaviour and about respecting others online. Encourage your child to think carefully before they post, text or share comments or photos so they don't hurt or upset others. Remind them there is a real person at the end of the screen.
- Encourage your child to come to you (or another trusted adult) if they are upset because of an online experience, even if they think they are to blame.
