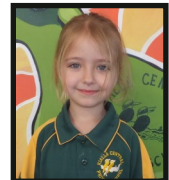

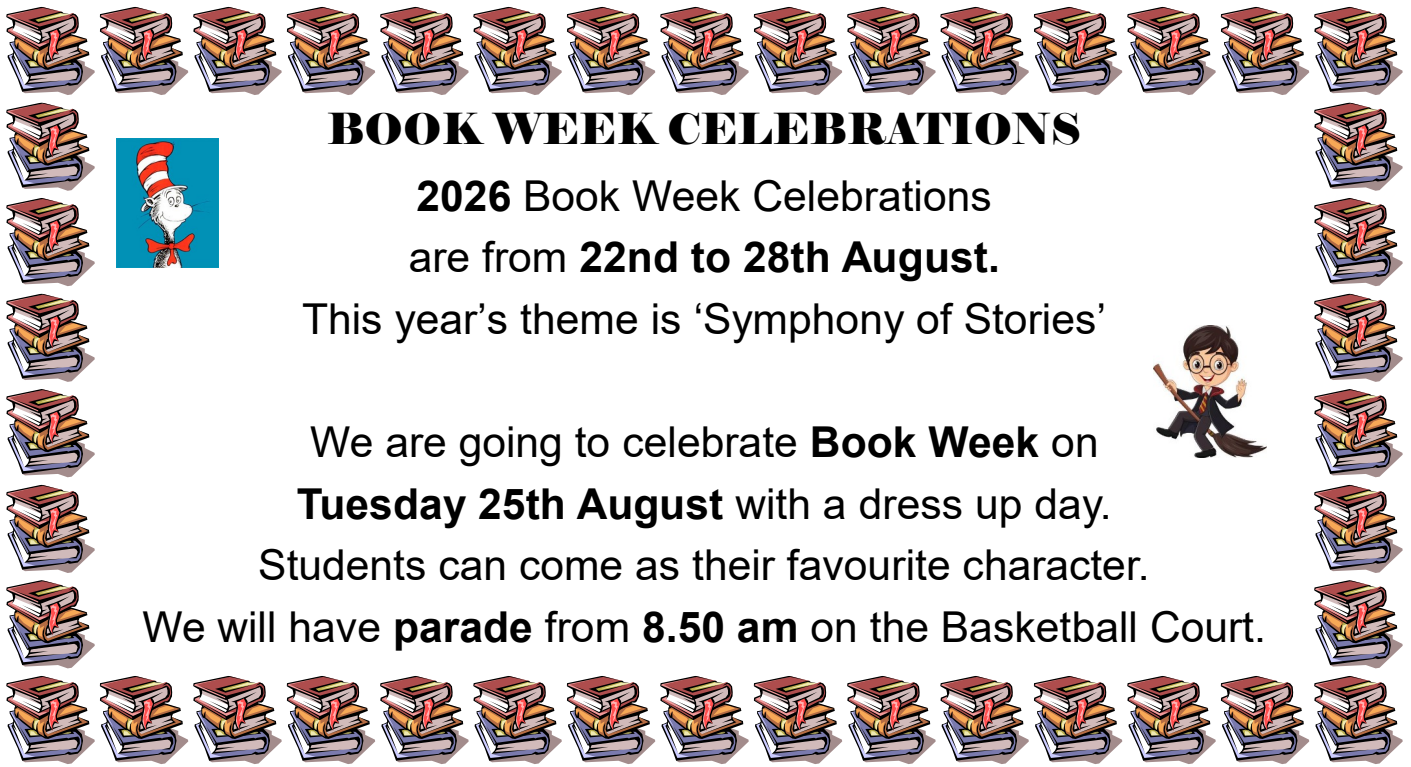

FOOTY WRAP Rounds 22

Fremantle (112) def Adelaide (88) Fremantle has secured the minor premiership and maintained its unbeaten record at Optus Stadium this season. Scores were tied early in the last quarter but the Dockers found another gear and finished strongly to secure the win.

St Kilda (94) def Richmond (45) The Saints had an easy win over the Tiges which kept their wildcard chances alive until Carlton dashed their hopes on Sunday.

Geelong (125) def North Melbourne (110) The Cats survived in an enthralling clash at Marvel Stadium, snatching the win after being 39 points down. The first quarter belonged to the Roos, the second to the Cats before an even second half.

Brisbane (95) def Gold Coast (53) The Lions, in their retro jumpers, were just too good for the Suns. Where missed opportunities and mistakes plagued Gold Coast, Brisbane was able to play a cleaner, pressure-based game that has earned them a tilt at Top 4 in the final round.

Hawks drew with Collingwood (92) History repeated itself when these 2 teams played out their second draw this season. And it was Dylan Moore who had the final play again, although this time he was unable to register a score.

Cost

\$20 per session/assessment.

Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.
