For being a positive member of K.C.P.S. Jemma just gets about her business without any fuss. She is a friendly student who does jobs without being asked. Thank you Jem!

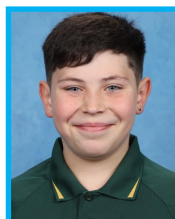

FOOTY WRAP Round 24 with G-Towner

Gold Coast (103) def St Kilda (80) In a scrappy encounter to end the season for both teams individual milestones were more of a focus than the outcome of the match. Bradley Hill, with 42 disposals in his 300th game, and Max Hall starred for the Saints. Teammates got around Nick Holman (Gold Coast) and Dougal Howard (StK) who are both retiring.

Brisbane (159) def Collingwood (96) The Lions won convincingly and seemed to have the game on their terms from the first bounce. Logan Morris had a night out with a career-high 8 goals. Brisbane is playing its best football at the right time of the year and will be tough opposition come finals.

Carlton (119) def Fremantle (82) The Dockers suffered their heaviest defeat of their season after the Blues continued on their winning way. Carlton was able to close a 4 goal deficit and roll into the Wildcard Round full of belief. The Dockers rested several key players but have concerns for Brennan Cox who came off in the first quarter with a calf injury.

Western Bulldogs (108) def Melbourne (87) The outcome of the game had more of an impact on the Dees who now have a wildcard game to contend with next week. The Doggies already knew where they'd be, and seemed to play with more purpose, confidence and cohesion. Injuries may influence next week, with the Bulldogs' Aaron Naughton (ankle) and Melbourne's Matt Jefferson (knee) both leaving the ground in the third quarter.

Geelong (133) def Richmond (76) It was an enjoyable way to end the Home and Away season for Cats fans. A comfortable win at home, Jeremy Cameron back out on the park, and a week off locked in.

Adelaide (157) def GWS (101) Adelaide secured a top 6 finish to the season with a convincing win at home. Taylor Walker kicked 6 goals in his final home and away game while Rankine and Thilthorpe joined the party. Giant Jake Stringer had his own tricks up his sleeve and hit the scoreboard with 6 majors.

Port Adelaide (105) def Essendon (95) In a Sunday afternoon thriller the Power conjured 2 late goals to steal a 10 point win and finish their season on a positive note. Bombers fans will be keen to look forward, with a new coach to be announced in coming days.

Hawthorn (107) def West Coast (45) Most interest in this game centred around whether the Hawks could win by enough to climb into third place on the ladder and avoid a potential trip to Perth to play Fremantle. That target was out of reach but they played a dominant game. Jack Gunstan celebrated his 300th game with a 5 goal haul.

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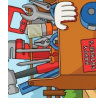
