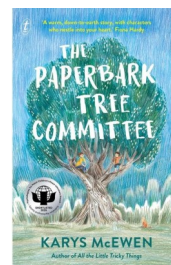
2 Daffy

Academic Games ...

Flynn, Axel, Xavier, Lachie, Emerson, Clementine, Milla, Jemma, Violetrose and Ainslee all went to the Academic Games at Gowrie Street Primary School last Thursday.

The first activity we completed was building a bridge out of pop sticks. We were allowed to use tape and hot glue. The aim was to build a bridge strong enough to hold a bucket that would gradually be filled with water.

While we waited for our bridges to dry, we participated in a debate. Our topic was: "Why are literacy and numeracy more important than mental and physical health?"

After the debates, it was time to test our bridges. Each bridge was placed between two tables with a 30-centimetre gap. We were very proud that our bridge held three litres of water!

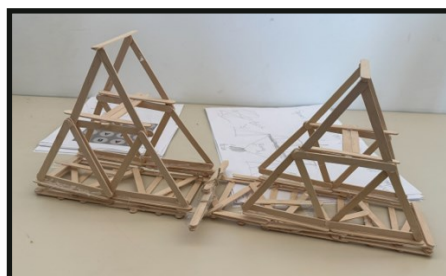
